Music / Performing Arts

Students at Altona North Primary School are encouraged to participate in a range of Performing Arts classes. The aim of the program is to enrich students' lives by giving them creative and artistic experiences, allowing them to gain an understanding and appreciation of Drama, Dance and Music.

In term 1, the Grade 3/4 students will use voice, body, movement and language to sustain role and create dramatic action with a sense of time and place. Visual Arts

The Visual Arts program enables children to be involved in numerous activities that aim to develop and extend individual artistic skills and creativity. Each lesson aims to cover skill application and art appreciation. Children will have the opportunity to share their ideas with their peers in a positive and encouraging learning environment..

In Term 1, year 3 & 4 students will explore the elements of lines, shape and pattern. Students will analyse a variety of artwork and discuss how the elements of art have been used and the ideas portrayed in the artwork,

Students will create drawings using a number of tools such as pencils, oil pastels and fine liners. Students will also be introduced to the concept of sketching and will explore applying varied amounts of pressure when applying the pencil to the paper.
